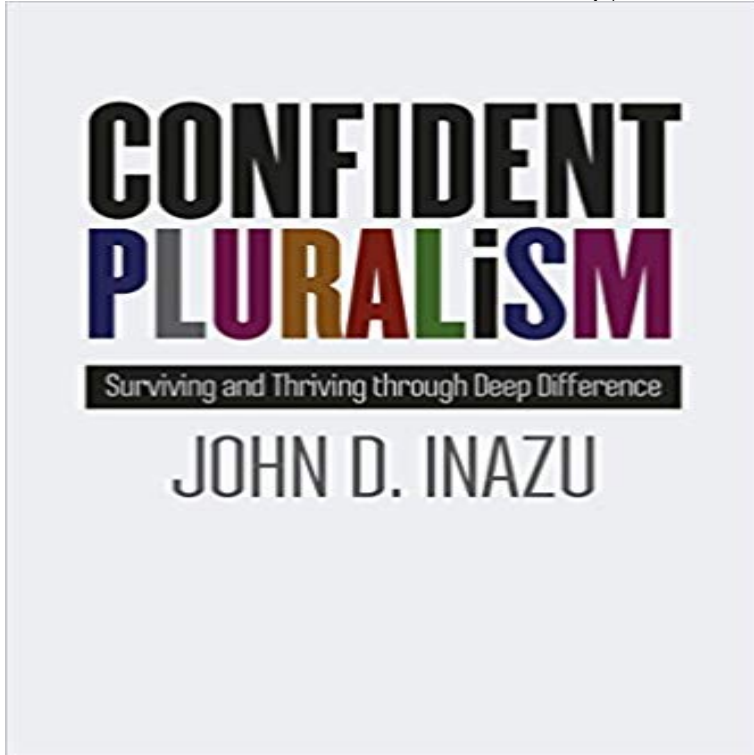


# Confident Pluralism: Surviving and Thriving through Deep Difference



In recent years, the United States has become increasingly polarized and divided. This fissure is evident across the nation in conflict over LGBTQ rights; in challenges to religious liberty; in clashes over abortion; in tensions between law enforcement and minority communities. With all of this physical and emotional violence enacted by our legal system and such seemingly irresolvable differences in beliefs, values, and identities across the country, we are forced to ask how can the people of this nation ever live in peace together? In *Confident Pluralism*, John D. Inazu analyzes the current state of the country, orients the contemporary United States within its broader history, and explores the ways that Americans can and must live together peaceably despite these deeply engrained differences. Pluralism is one of the founding creeds of the United States yet America's society and legal system continues to face deep, unsolved structural problems in dealing with differing cultural anxieties, and minority viewpoints. Inazu not only argues that it is possible to cohabit peacefully in this country, but also lays out realistic guidelines for our society and legal system to achieve the new American dream through civic practices that value toleration over protest, humility over defensiveness, and persuasion over coercion. An essential clarion call during one of the most troubled times in US history, *Confident Pluralism* offers a refreshing argument for how the legal system can protect people's personal beliefs and differences and shows how we can build toward a healthier future of tolerance, patience, and empathy.
