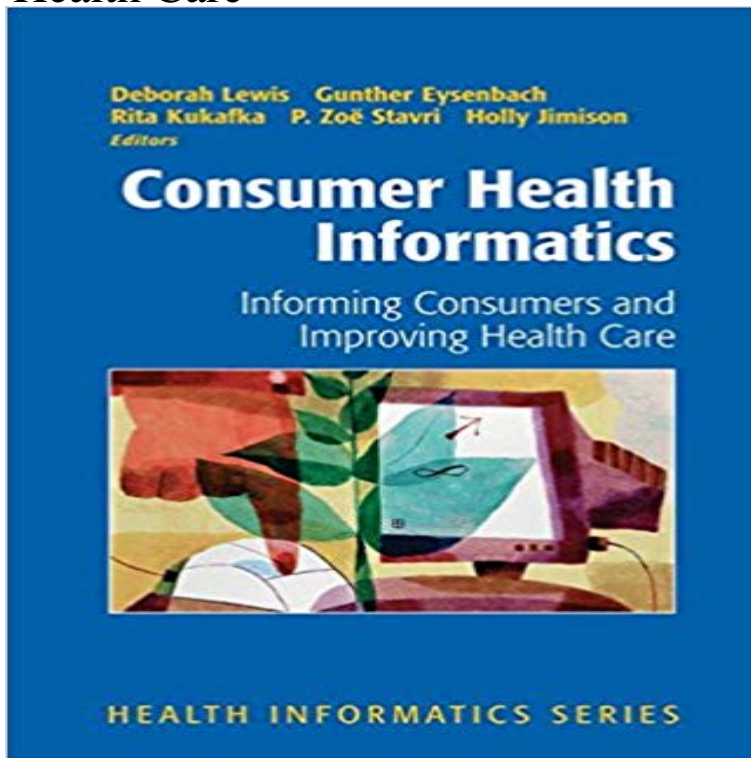


# Consumer Health Informatics: Informing Consumers and Improving Health Care
