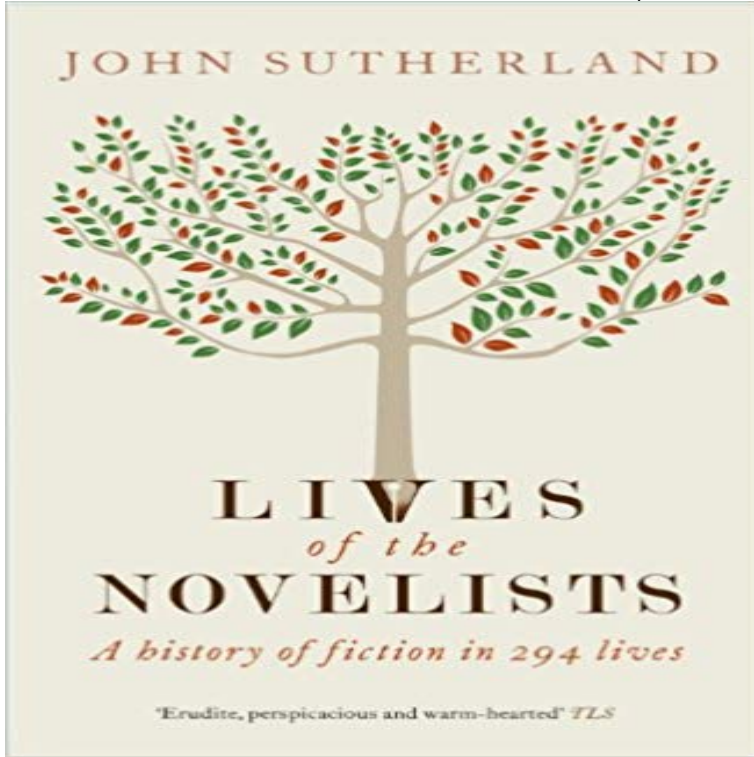


Lives of the Novelists: A History of Fiction in 294 Lives
