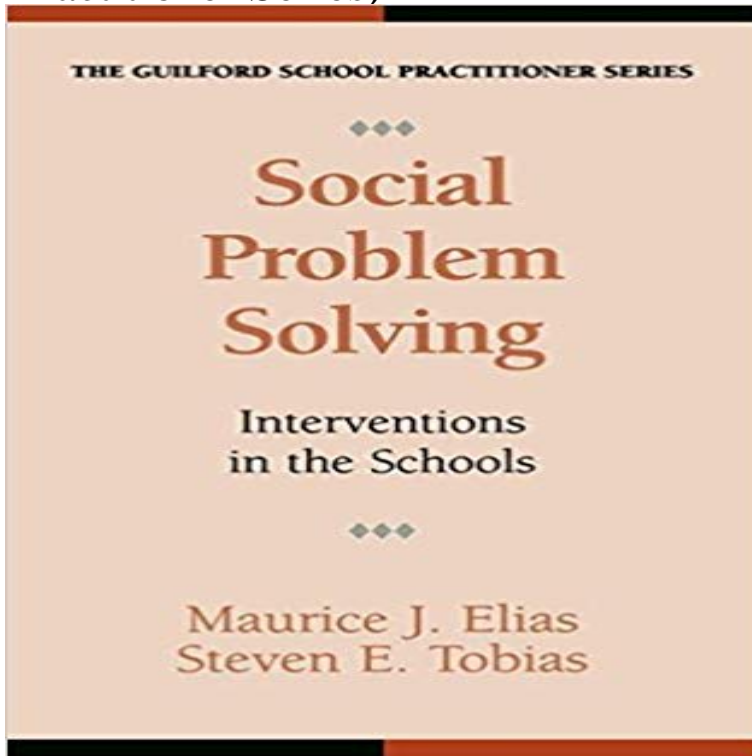


# Social Problem Solving: Interventions in the Schools (Guilford School Practitioner Series)
