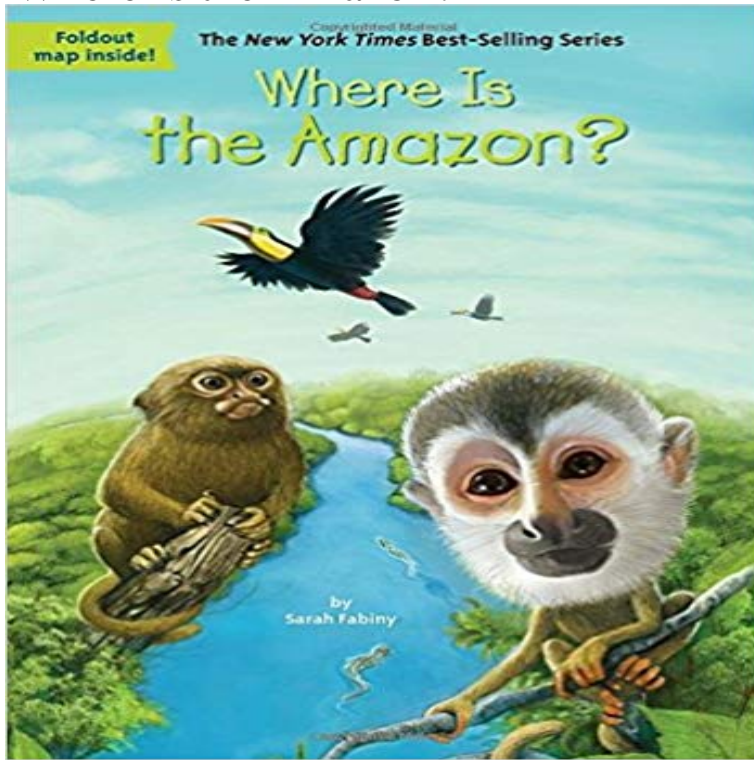


Where Is the Amazon?
