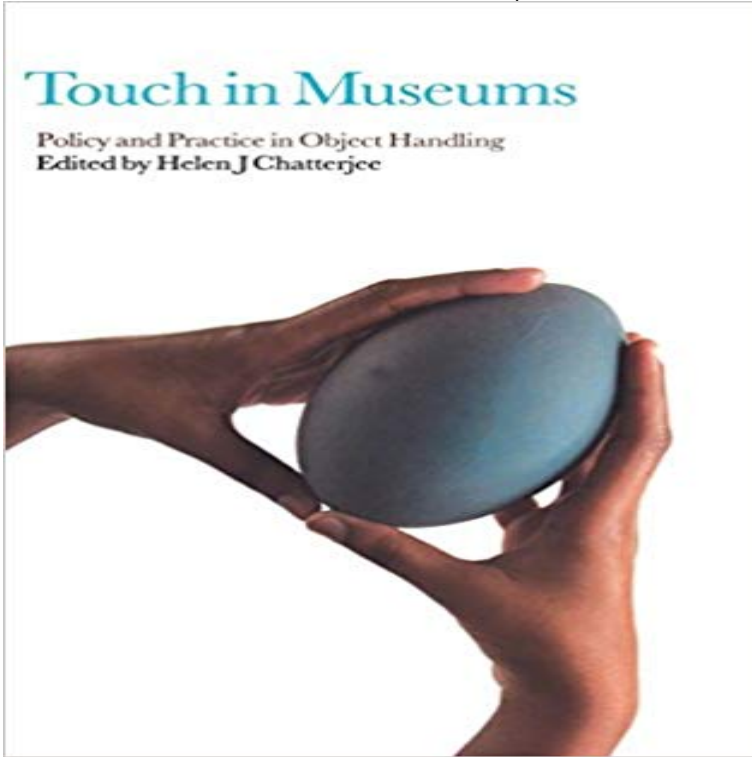


Touch in Museums: Policy and Practice in Object Handling
