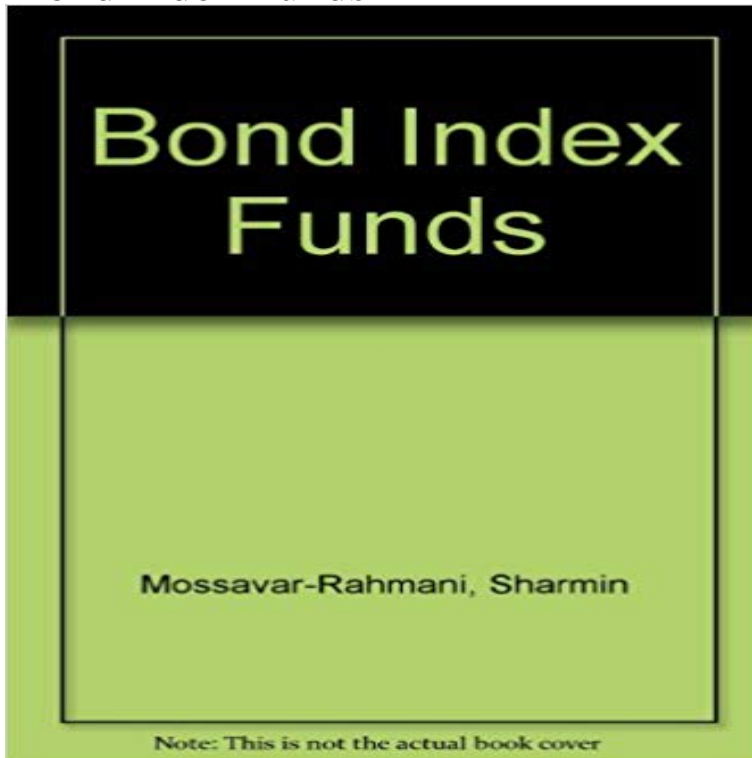


Bond Index Funds
